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Candidates, firms and CASB form a valuable partnership throughout the competency-based CASB program. This partnership ensures tomorrow's CAs are prepared to meet the challenge of an ever-changing business environment.

CASB recognizes and appreciates the commitment and support demonstrated by firms in planning and delivering in-house programs to assist students as they prepare to successfully challenge the 2008 UFE.

In order to minimize duplication of effort, many firms have asked CASB for a listing of the simulations that will be used in the Module 6 program. Appendix A contains an August 2008 calendar which identifies simulations that will be used during the Face to Face Session (FFIS) while Appendix B lists the simulations that will be posted on the UFEPrep.com website effective May 5, 2008. 2002 to 2007 UFE reports published by the CICA will also be accessible from the website.

Newly prepared simulations will be used whenever candidates submit work for evaluation- Simulations of the Day (August 5 & 12), Practice Simulations (August 8 & 15) and the Qualification UFE Simulations (August 19, 20 & 21). These simulations are italicized and highlighted in Appendix A.

Consistent with prior years, no UFE simulations from 2006 or 2007 will be used by CASB in Module 6. These have been left for candidates to use in their own study plans.

In response to suggestions obtained from our 2007 Module 6 candidate survey, we have made two significant changes to the FFIS. First, the overall course has been reduced by one day. Historically, one of the Mondays during Module 6 has fallen on a statutory holiday – this year it is August 4. This will allow candidates who are completing Module 5 in July, an extra day between Modules 5 & 6 to be better rested. The statutory holiday also presents logistical problems as the university facilities we rent are either closed or schedule only skeleton crews to deal with any facility problems. Second, we have attempted to provide candidates with more time to debrief their own responses. As candidates now have many years of competency based material available, we will assume candidates are ready to write simulations upon arrival. Material previously covered on the first couple of days will be posted on the UFEPrep.com website and candidates are strongly encouraged to review it prior to attending the FFIS.

In late March, each candidate potentially eligible to write the UFE in 2008 will receive a comprehensive memo outlining the format, content, and resource material available for the 2008 offering of Module 6. This memo will include the appendices we have provided to you. Ensuring CASB candidates are prepared to successfully challenge the 2008 UFE is a primary goal of both CASB and accounting firms. We welcome your firms' participation in preparing candidates for this integral part of their career.
